PROPOSALS INVOLVING GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE SHARES AND TO ISSUE SHARES RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information and to seek your approval for the proposals involving general mandates to repurchase Shares and to allot, issue and deal with Shares and re-election of Directors at the Annual General Meeting.

2. GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 10 September 2010, resolutions of the shareholders were passed giving general unconditional mandates to the Directors to:

- (i) to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of such resolution;
- (ii) allot, issue and otherwise deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing such resolution; and
- (iii) add to the general mandate for issuing Shares as mentioned in paragraph (ii) above an amount representing the total nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company repurchased by the Company under the general mandate granted to the Directors to repurchase Shares as mentioned in paragraph (i) above.

The above general mandates which was adopted on 10 September 2010 will lapse at the conclusion of the forthcoming Annual General Meeting. It is therefore proposed to seek your approval of the ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to give fresh general mandates to the Directors.

3. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE NEW SHARES

Two ordinary resolutions will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting namely ordinary resolutions nos.5 and 6 granting to the Directors a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20 percent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the resolution (i.e. not exceeding 391,528,610 shares based on the issued share capital of the Company of 1,957,643,050 shares as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that such issued share capital remains the same as at the date of passing the resolution) and

adding to such general mandate so granted to the Directors any Shares representing the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares repurchased by the Company after the granting of the general mandate to repurchase Shares up to 10 percent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the Repurchase Resolution.

4. RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of nine Directors, namely Mr. Lee Lap, Mdm. Leung Lai Ping, Mr. Tommy Lee, Mr. Wong Shiu Kee, Mr. Chan Siu Kang, Mr. Lo Yiu Hee, Mr. Tong Hin Wor, Mr. Lee Ka Sze, Carmelo and Mr. Lee Wing Sing, Vincent.

Pursuant to the Bye-laws of the Company, Mr. Tommy Lee, Mr. Chan Siu Kang and Mr. Lo Yiu Hee shall retire from office at the Annual General Meeting and shall be eligible and offer themselves for re-election. Details of these retiring Directors proposed for re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in the Appendix II to this circular.

5. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

On pages 12 to 15 of this circular, you will find a notice convening the Annual General Meeting at which the following resolutions will be proposed:

- an ordinary resolution to grant to the Directors a general mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase Shares representing up to 10 percent of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the Repurchase Resolution:
- an ordinary resolution to grant to the Directors a general mandate to authorise the
 Directors to issue, allot and deal with Shares representing up to 20 percent of the
 issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of such resolution;
 and
- an ordinary resolution to extend the general mandate which will be granted to the
 Directors to issue, allot and deal with additional Shares by adding to it the number

7. VOTING BY WAY OF POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, all votes of the shareholders at the Annual General Meeting must be taken by poll. The chairman of the meeting will therefore demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote at the Annual General Meeting pursuant to the Bye-laws of the Company and the Company will announce the results of the poll in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

8. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors are pleased to recommend Mr. Tommy Lee, Mr. Chan Siu Kang and Mr. Lo Yiu Hee, details of whom are set out in Appendix II of this circular, for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. The Directors believe that the Repurchase Proposal, the general mandate for Directors to issue new Shares and the extension of the general mandate to issue Shares are all in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors also recommend that all shareholders should vote in favour of the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Share Repurchase Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Proposal.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,957,643,050 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the Repurchase Resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Resolution to repurchase a maximum of 195,764,305 Shares representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Proposal is in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and its shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its memorandum of association and bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda. Bermuda law provides that the amount of capital repaid in connection with a share repurchase may only be paid out of the capital paid up on the relevant shares, or the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for the purpose. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of either the funds of the Company that would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company. Further, a company cannot purchase its own shares if on the date on which the purchase is to be effected, there are reasonable grounds for believing that the Company is, or after the purchase would be, unable to pay its liabilities as they become due.

The Directors at present have not decided which proposed source of funding is to be used when the Repurchase Proposal is exercised.

There might be an adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2011 in the event that the Repurchase Proposal was to be exercised in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Proposal to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. GENERAL

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Resolution and in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda and Hong Kong.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Proposal is approved by the shareholders of the Company.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Proposal is approved by the shareholders of the Company.

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Resolution, a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a shareholder or group of shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Lee & Leung (B.V.I.) Limited held on a beneficial basis a total of 1,252,752,780 shares representing approximately 63.99% of the issued share capital of the Company. Based on such shareholdings and in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchases Proposal, the aggregate shareholdings of Lee & Leung (B.V.I.) Limited would be increased to approximately 71.1% of the issued share capital of the Company. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeover Code as a result of any repurchases made under the Repurchase Proposal. In the event that the Repurchase Proposal is exercised in full, the number of Shares held by the public would not fall below 25%.

6. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not repurchased any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

1. Mr. Tommy Lee, aged 33, was appointed as executive director and vice chairman of the Company on 14 January 2008 and was appointed as chief executive officer on 1st November 2010. Mr. Tommy Lee studied Economics in the Seneca College in Canada. Mr. Tommy Lee had been the Vice President of a private company which is principally engaged in the manufacturing and sale of printed circuit board and he was responsible for the overall management and strategic planning of the private company during the past years.

Mr. Tommy Lee is the son of Mr. Lee Lap and Mdm. Leung Lai Ping and the brother of Mr. Lee Wing Sing, Vincent, all being directors and substantial shareholders of the Company. Save as disclosed herein, Mr. Tommy Lee does not have any relationship with any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company as defined in the Listing Rules.

There is no service agreement with the Company. He is entitled to an annual remuneration of HK\$240,000 since 1 April 2011 which has been determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company and prevailing market situation.

Save as executive director, vice chairman and chief executive officer of the Company, Mr. Tommy Lee does not hold any other positions in the Company or any of its subsidiaries and did not hold any other major appointments or qualifications. He has not held any directorships in any other listed public companies in the last three years.

Lee & Leung (B.V.I.) Limited owns 1,252,752,780 shares of the Company. Lee & Leung (B.V.I.) Limited is wholly-owned by First Trend Management (PTC) Limited as trustee for Lee & Leung Family Unit Trust. All the units in Lee & Leung Family Unit Trust are held by HSBC International Trustee Limited as trustee for Lee & Leung Family Trust. Mr. Lee Lap is the settlor of the Lee & Leung Family Trust. The discretionary beneficiaries of the Lee & Leung Family Trust are Mdm. Leung Lai Ping, the children of Mr. Lee Lap and Mdm. Leung Lai Ping and the offspring of such children. Save for being one of the beneficiaries of the Lee & Leung Family Trust, Mr. Tommy Lee does not have any interests in the securities in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance.

2. **Mr. Chan Siu Kang**, aged 74, was appointed as an independent non-executive director in 2004. He is also a member of the audit committee and the remuneration committee of the Company. Mr. Chan is a graduate of the National Taiwan University with bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering. Mr. Chan has 30 years' manufacturing and senior management experience in the electronics industry. Among which, he has held 20 years in the role as general manager and director.

Pursuant to a letter of appointment between Mr. Chan and the Company, his term of as an independent non-executive director with the Company is for a period of two years from 1 January 2011 and is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the annual

general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Bye-laws of the Company. His director's fee is to be determined by the Board and to be authorized by the shareholders of the Company at the annual general meeting with reference to the prevailing market practice, the Company's remuneration policy, his duties and responsibilities with the group and his contribution to the group. He received director's fee of HK\$100,000 for the year ended 31 March 2011.

Mr. Chan does not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years. Save as disclosed above, he does not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Company's group.

Mr. Chan is and was not connected with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Chan does not have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance.

3. **Mr. Lo Yiu Hee**, aged 53, was appointed as an independent non-executive director in 2004. He is also the Chairman of the audit committee and a member of the remuneration committee of the Company. Mr. Lo holds bachelor and master degrees in business administration from the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Mr. Lo is a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and CPA Australia. Mr. Lo has over 20 years of experience in finance and accounting in various listed companies. - (iii) the date on which the authority set out in this Resolution is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the shareholders in general meeting of the Company; and

"Rights Issue" means an offer of shares open for a period fixed by the directors of the Company to the holders of shares of the Company on the register on a fixed record date in proportion to their then holdings of such shares as at that date (subject to such exclusions or other arrangements as the directors of the Company may deem necessary or expedient in relation to fractional entitlements or having regard to any restrictions or obligations under the laws of, or the requirements of any recognised regulatory body or any stock exchange in, any territory outside Hong Kong applicable to the Company)."

6. As special business, to consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution:

ORDINARY RESOLUTION

"THAT subject to the passing of the Resolutions set out in items 4 and 5 of the notice convening this meeting, the general mandate granted to the directors of the Company to allot, issue and deal with additional shares pursuant to the Resolution set out in item 5 of the notice convening this meeting be and is hereby extended by the addition thereto of an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of shares in the capital of the Company repurchased by the Company under the authority granted pursuant to the Resolution set out in item 4 of the notice convening this meeting, provided that such amount of shares so repurchased shall not exceed 10 percent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the passing of the said Resolution."
